
Robust Developmental EEG Practices from Collection to Analysis Workshop

Description

This workshop will address how to collect and analyze high-density EEG in developmental populations with Magstim EGI systems and the <u>Harvard Automated Processing Pipeline</u> <u>for Electroencephalography (HAPPE)</u> software. Current best practices and strategies to promote robust, standardized data collection and analysis will be emphasized. Participants will be guided through processing publicly available developmental <u>Magstim EGI</u> data or their own data through HAPPE 2.0 software for resting-state EEG (HAPPE pipeline) and ERP analyses (HAPPE+ER pipeline).
